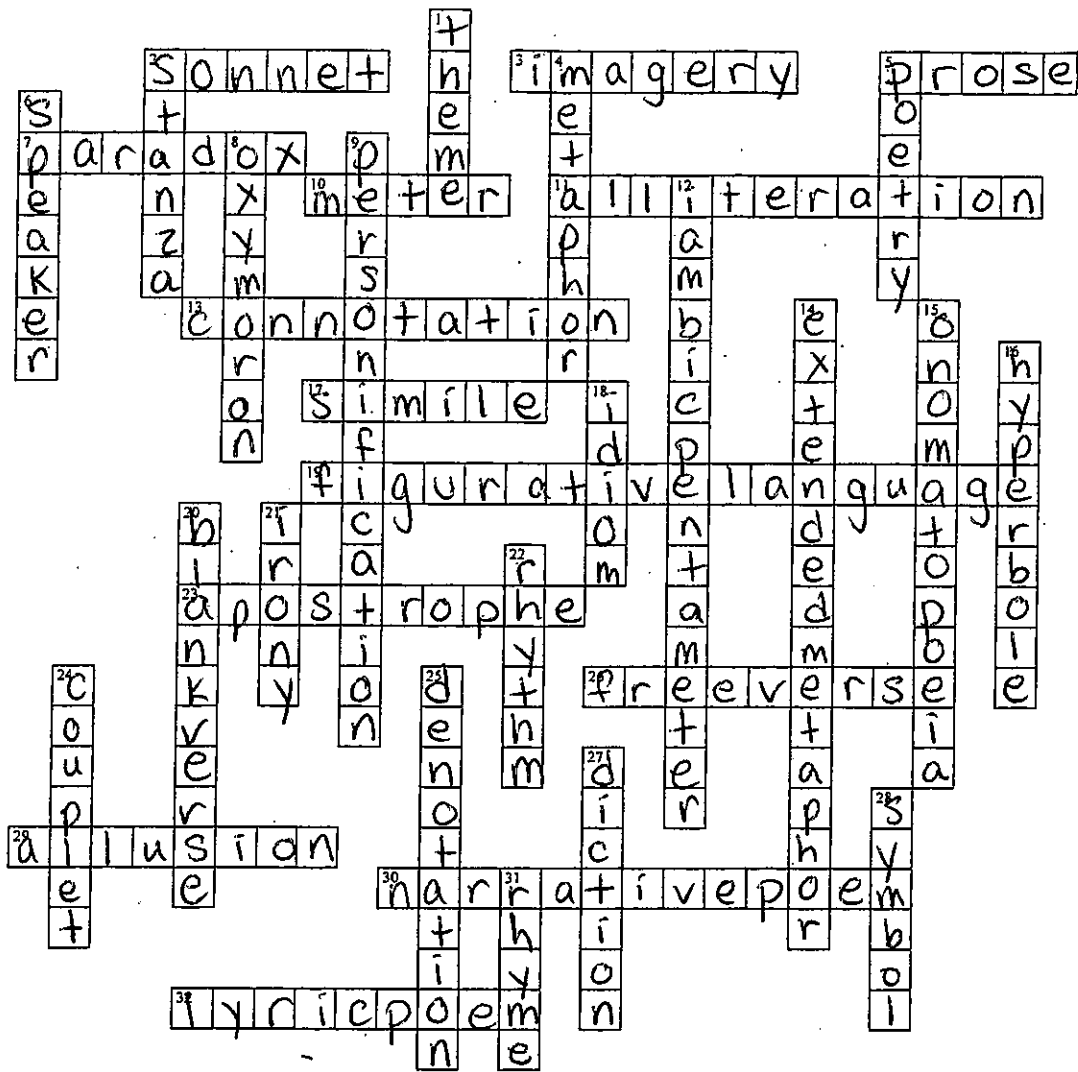

- 2 A fourteen-line lyric poem focused on a single theme
- 3 Description using one or more of the five senses
- 5 Ordinary written language
- 7 "We must wage war to achieve peace."
- 10 A rhythmical pattern composed of stresses or beats
- 11 "Peter Piper picked a peck of pickled peppers..."
- 13 The set of associations a word calls to mind
- 17 Comparison between two things using "like" or "as"
- 19 Speech not meant to be taken literally
- 23 "O God, my mind stretches assunder..."
- 26 Verse without a set rhythmical pattern
- 29 Reference to a famous person, place, or thing
- 30 Verse that tells a story
- 32 Verse that expresses feelings or observations

- 1 Main idea or lesson
- 2 A poem's "paragraph"
- 4 A comparison between two things in which one is spoken of as if it were something else
- 5 A literary composition of verse, usually with deep feeling
- 6 A poem's narrator
- 8 "freezing fire"
